The first in our 2018 film programme on **climate change related issues** is on a **FOOD theme** and takes place 7.30pm in Brambles café bar upstairs room in Holmfirth on:

Our feature film is **CARNAGE: Swallowing the Past**, an amusing and thought-provoking 60 minute mockumentary about **VEGANISM**. This 2017 film written and directed by the comedian Simon Amstell, reflects on our current meat-eating lifestyle from 50 years hence, from a time when we have all given up meat and dairy products. Will Veganism replace Carnism? Come and watch!



With cameo appearances by Martin Freeman, Joanna Lumley, Jamie Oliver, the film purports to be an educational documentary explaining to young people in 2067, why in the past people killed animals and ate meat. Whilst meat eating is on the decline in the UK, across the world it is rising and the animal production industry is a major contributor to man-made greenhouse gas emissions.

The film will be preceded by a short introduction about Veganism and the film. After showing the 60 minute film, there will be a discussion on the issues involved, led by our speaker.

If time permits we will show some short film clips on other related food issues impacting on a sustainable lifestyle here in the UK.
