

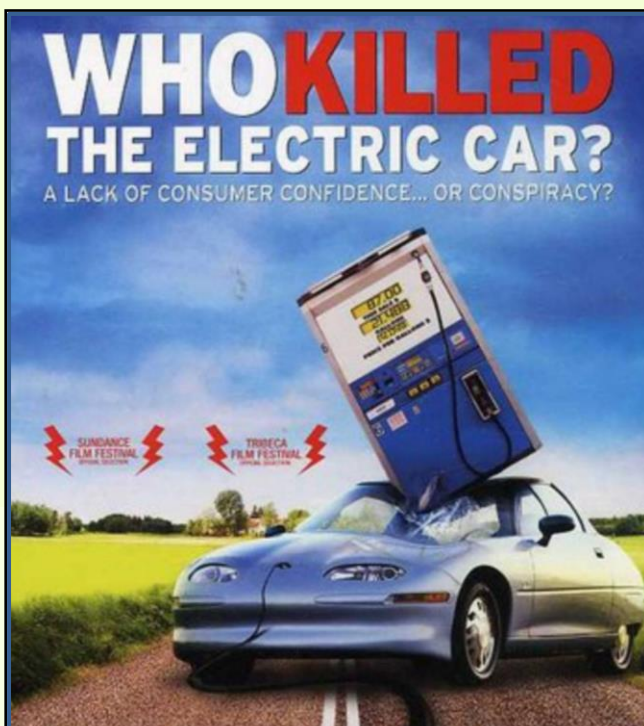
HoTT Film Nights

As the **electric car revolution** is nearly upon us, we are showing some short film clips about the latest developments on zero emission electric cars, and also taking a look-back to the early 2000's when the car and oil industries combined to try and squeeze out the electric car.

HoTT are screening the film **WHO KILLED THE ELECTRIC CAR?** This award winning 90 minute film made in 2006, tells the tale of how General Motors, the largest motor manufacturer in the world, first developed and then killed off their revolutionary EV1 electric car.



It ran on electricity, produced no emissions, and was among the fastest, most efficient production cars ever built.

So why did General Motors crush its fleet of EV1 electric vehicles in the Arizona desert?

Launched by GM in 1996, the EV1 electric vehicle was a revolutionary modern car, requiring no gas, no oil changes and no silencer. But the fanfare surrounding the EV1's launch disappeared and the cars followed. Was it lack of consumer demand, as carmakers claimed, or were other forces at work?

Those questions and more are answered in this compelling documentary that shines a light into the dark corners of the U.S. economy and government.
